

- The Alaska Highway (also called the ALCAN) is a 1,390-mile road stretching from Dawson Creek, BC, Canada,
- · to Delta Junction, Alaska.
- The road was originally built mostly by the US Army as a supply route during World War II.
- During the summer, gas, food, and lodging are available about every 20 to 50 miles.
- During the winter, services are VERY limited, so always be prepared!
